The members of the Board of Directors over the last eleven months have been as follows, Chairperson: Margaret Smallwood, Vice– Chair: Raymond Gaston, Secretary: Jennifer Butler, and Board Members, Tracey Lampton, Gary Prior, Burt Doolan, and Andrew Morrell. Over the last eleven months we have had two of the original Board step down and replaced. Those being Burt Doolan and Andrew Morrell being replaced by Kevin Aldridge and David Morrell respectively.

Also a huge thank you to Lynette Klukas who the Board has had to hire as the Corporation's Book Keeper and she has been a vital part of the Corporation getting on it's feet.

Since November 2012 the Board of Directors have been starting to implement the Indigenous Land Use Agreement that we have with the Coordinator General and North Queensland Bulk Ports.

Part of the implementation of the ILUA has been to undertake due diligence and inspections of investment properties and the purchases of two properties have been started as we go to press. The properties are situated in Mt Nutt Rd Bowen with one being a three bedroom house and the other being a four bedroom house.

Other parts of the ILUA that have been started to be implemented are the Workforce Resource Plan and the Wetlands Project.

The Wetlands Project has been started by the formulation of a Wetlands Project Plan which was accepted by the Board of Directors in December 2012 as a live document to allow for changes to be made when needed.

Also the Board of Directors passed a WRP Plan in January 2013 as a live document to allow for updates and changes to be made into the future.

The Workforce Resource Plan has been started and implemented by the mailing of letters to our members, to which we had a wonderful response from our members and their family members who responded to the Workforce Resource Plan questionnaire and sent in their Resume's.

The next steps that the Board of Directors need to undertake are the selection and employment of personnel to undertake work in the Wetlands Project and the selection and purchase of the equipment required for the work to be undertaken.

Over the next two months the Board of Directors will be working closely with the Coordinator General and North Queensland Bulk Ports and the Office Coordinator, to implement the start of works in the Wetlands Project which is the pilot program for not only Juru Enterprises but also for NQBP and the CG.

This will enable our workers to look after and improve the wetlands at Abbot Point which are classed as an Important Wetland of Australia within the Significant Wetlands of Australia Directory. It will be a massive job that will include the removal of noxious weeds and feral animals. Also the removal of a Bund wall that was constructed in the early 1980,s.
